Stepping onto the hundred-foot

I've reached this sphincter-tight-ening point by climbing a needle-like granite spire looming behind

On the other side of the bridge, the even-steeper Nimbus Tower

awaits.

It's the highest point along Canada's first fully operational via ferrata (Italian for iron road), a mountain route equipped with fixed cables, iron rungs, ladders and bridges deep in the heart of B.C's Pursull Mountains.
