A SWISS SLICE OF THE

Tucked between the Alps and Italy, Ticino offers the best of both worlds

Here, in the only one of Switze Here, in the only one of Switzer-land's 26 cantons located entirely south of the Alps, sun-drenched, palm tree-lined promenades meet glacier-fed lakes. A Mediterranean climate and attitude prevail, but you can still savour la dolee vita served with a dollop of Swiss ef-

Mention Switzerland and choco-Mention Switzerland and choco-late, cheese, cows and army knives might come to mind, not pasta, gelato, Vespas or piazzas. Yet in the southernmost Swiss canton of Ticino, Italian language, culture, architecture and cuisine predom-inate. These are just a few of the qualities that make Ticino – mida way between Zurich and Milan — an enticing destination, even for posoble from the German and for people from the German and French-speaking parts of Switzer-

land.

To be sure, Ticino's alpine vistas
can be as beautiful as any place in
the central or northernparts of the
country, as can its postcard-perfect
lakes, verdant valleys and peaceful pastures where the tinkle of rbells accompanies the ringing tomanesque church bells. But cowhells accompanies the ringing of Romanesque church bells. But what really sets Ticino apart from the rest of Switzerland is the laid-back vibe, Italian charm and un-pretentious yet delicious cuisine you'll find here on the sunny side



of the SWISS AIPS.

Picture sipping a signature white Merlot del Ticino on a lakeside café patio — or in a granite grotto under the shade of a chestnut tree — while dining on Ticinese pumpkin soup, mortadella, busecca, risotto and fresh lake fish. BELLISSIMA BELLINZONA
The capital of Ticino is not the canton's largest city of Lugano It's the town of Bellinzona, just 20

minutes from Lugano by rail. Bel-lissima Bellinzona, as many who have visited fondly call it, is most famous for its complex of medieval fortifications, designated a UNE-SCO World Heritage Site in 2000. Together with a defensive wall en-closing the entire valley, the three castles that make up the Fortress of Bellinzona – Castelgrande, Casello Montebello and Castello S o Corbar — once controlled t

cultural crossroads at the intersec-tion of the trade and pilgrimage routes leading to the St. Gotthard, Lukmanier and San Bernardino passes, they remain among the most impressive examples of me-dieval defensive architecture anydieval defensive architecture any-where in the Alps. Dominating a rocky peak overlooking the valley, Castelgrande (as its name implies) is the largest of the trio.
